How does someone get to a real live person at Hewitt without knowing passwords and IDs?

Here is the answer:

You still must be prepared to provide the personal information necessary to identify yourself or the person you are calling for.

Monday through Friday 8 a.m. to 8 p.m. ET Call Hewitt 1-888-435-7563 - when they answer and after they ask for your ID key in *0# (star, zero, pound). Someone will answer

Monday through Friday 8 a.m. to 6 p.m. ET Call HR Direct – 1-888-678-6787 and select Option 3. You will get a contact person who will transfer you to the right Hewitt benefit person.

Jerry Vandegrift grew up in Central Park, Alabama. He was predeceased in death by his father: Erskine Vandegrift, Sr., mother; Lillian Coupland Vandegrift; brothers: Erskine Vandegrift Jr., and Frank Vandegrift; and his son: John Stuart Vandegrift. Eighteen years later he began work with Southern Company Services thus remaining with The Southern Company his entire career. His honors include IEEE's Outstanding Engineer Award and an Electrical Engineer of the Year award. Following his retirement in 1986, Jerry went to Africa to install a generator thus providing electrical power for the first time to the Good Shepherd Hospital in the Kananga area of what is now the Democratic Republic of Congo. The system also provided water to the hospital and surrounding village. He returned three more times to install a second generator and then maintained the system over many years.
