Greetings everyone from your Past-Prez. I want to thank those of you who were able to attend our January meeting, we had a good turnout for our first meeting of the year. The speaker was Edgar Nunez from Southern Power Company and he shared information with us about the wind generating facilities that Southern Power owns. I thought Edgar's presentation was very interesting and very informative. Someone mentioned to me after the meeting that Edgar would have made a good college professor, given how easy it was to understand the subject he was presenting and how interesting he was in his delivery. I happened to run into Edgar about four weeks later and found out that he did, in fact, teach college courses at one point in his career. Also I might be a little bias given that I retired from Southern Power, so I did appreciate the feedback I received from some of you. It was good to hear that others of you enjoyed the presentation.

If you retired from Southern Company prior to 2001, it is safe to say that Southern Power didn't exist during your tenure. Southern Power is a relatively young subsidiary of the Southern Company. It was formed back in 2001 as a means for Southern Company to participate in the wholesale market. When I retired five short years ago, Southern Power's generation was mostly composed of gas-fired units. We had acquired a little over 50 MWs of solar (our first solar project was 30 MWs in 2010) and we had just completed a 115 MW biomass (wood burner) plant in Texas in 2012, which was the last project I worked on prior to retirement. We had no wind generation projects and I don't recall any serious discussions on wind generation before I left. It sure would have been cool to get to watch the construction on a few of those wind projects, but the timing for me just didn't work

out. Today Southern Power has over 1,440 MWs of solar capacity and over 1,700 MWs of wind capacity, with an overall capacity of more than 12,600 MWs. They've certainly grown their portfolio since I left. I just realized, they are now more than double the combined generating capacity of Gulf Power and Mississippi Power, if my calculations are correct. Well that's enough commercial time for Southern Power.

I want to reiterate what I wrote for the last newsletter, we still have some vacant committee chairs that need to be filled. Please consider joining the leadership team to ensure that our organization functions as it was intended to. Remember these are COMMITTEE chairs, not intended to be a one person operation. Don't wait to be asked, think about where you can get involved and contact some of your retiree buddies to join you. We currently have immediate needs in three areas, a group to handle arrangements for our meetings, a group to plan programs for our meetings (half of which are already planned), and a group to plan some fun fellowship activities outside of our regular meetings. He will speak on "Powell Avenue Steam Plant – The Once and Future Power Plant". Hope to see many of you at the meeting.

Also I am pleased to announce that our executive speaker for our annual Spring Luncheon at the Pelham Civic Complex this year will be Tom Fanning, Chairman, President and CEO of Southern Company.
